Our approach to the study of communication is centered around six competencies for personal, professional and community development. These competencies are:

- 1. Interpersonal Communication: Build communication skills necessary for successful interactions with others.
- 2. Organizational Communication: Explore communication that fosters collaborative organizational cultures.
- Public Relations and Strategic Communication: Cultivate relationships between organizations and their publics, achieving organizational goals.
- 4. Rhetoric and Civic Engagement: Foster community leadership through understanding and producing persuasive messages to promote action.
- Media Studies and Production: Analyze the connections among media technologies, culture and society, and create critical media projects.
- 6. Science, Health, Environmental and Risk Communication: Help experts and the public communicate with each other about science, health, risk and environmental sustainability.
