# **Latin (Certificate)**

The Certificate in Latin will allow students to document their competence in and knowledge of the Latin language for scholarship opportunities, employers and graduate schools. It will also allow them to demonstrate their knowledge of the historical importance and influence of the Latin language and ancient and medieval Latin-speaking cultures, both for the documentary purposes listed above and for their own educational enrichment.

## **Plan Requirements**

A total of 12 semester hours is required; at least six credit hours must be taken at NC State. The remaining credit hours may be taken through affiliate programs (e.g. the UNC Language Exchange (https://fll.chass.ncsu.edu/undergraduate/language\_exchange.php)) or satisfied by transfer credit.
