# Spanish (Minor)

The objective of the minor in a world language is to enable students majoring in any field to acquire proficiency in an additional language, understanding of the culture, and knowledge of the countries in which the language is spoken.

#### **Admissions**

To be admitted to the program, a student must have a GPA of at least 2.0. Application for admission to any University minor program is now available via MyPack Portal. Admission will be based upon the student's academic record, and in most cases no longer requires departmental review. To declare a Spanish Minor, go to the Add a Minor (https://studentservices.ncsu.edu/your-degree/coda-home/add-a-minor/) page. (Students may declare the minor when they are enrolled in a class that counts toward the minor.)

### Certification

Students should declare the minor as soon as they have completed the first course for the minor, and complete their course work according to their minor degree audit, and the minor requirements. Students can monitor their progress toward completing the minor by viewing their Minor Degree Audit online, anytime, in MyPack Portal. Questions regarding unmet course requirements on the Minor Degree Audit (indicated by a red 'X') should be directed to the Minor Coordinator, below. Students contact the Director of Undergraduate Advising (https://wlc.chass.ncsu.edu/about/contact-us/), once they have completed all of their courses for the minor, or during the registration period for the student's final semester at NC State, in order to complete the final certification of the minor. Students will receive official recognition on their transcripts for the completed minor.

## **Plan Requirements**

- · Completion of 15 credit hours is required.
- At least nine of the 15 credits must be above the 200 level.
- Nine credit hours must be taken at NC State. A maximum of six (6) credit hours may be transferred into the minor from another institution.
- The Department of World Languages and Cultures will determine which courses transferred from other institutions may qualify to meet requirements for the minor.
- A maximum of six credits from a non-NC State study abroad program
  may count towards the minor. Credits earned in NC State-sponsored
  study abroad programs for Spanish count as if they were earned on
  the NC State campus.
- A grade of 'C-' or better is required in all courses in the minor program and an overall GPA of 2.0 must be maintained in the minor courses.

- All courses in the minor must be taken for a letter grade. Credit-only (S/U) grade is not permitted.
- A maximum of TWO (2) courses may double-count between major departmental requirements and courses counting toward the minor.
- A maximum of TWO (2) courses may double-count between courses counting toward this minor and additional minors.
- No courses for the minor may be taken for S/U credit.
